Since then, the school has grown to become one of the UK's leading independent day and boarding schools for children aged 3 to 18.

A level

In Sixth Form, each student is supported as an individual, with a personalised experience that nurtures their strengths and encourages ambition.



All students take a minimum of three A level subjects, which can be complemented by a voluntary Extended Project Qualification (EPQ), Enrichment and a rich programme of sport and performing arts, which provide excellent opportunities for personal growth.

We promote academic challenge, intellectual curiosity and independence, helping students develop the skills needed for further study and employment. Increased autonomy allows them to take responsibility for their learning while balancing wider commitments.

Our students go on to diverse pathways, including university, apprenticeships and direct entry into the workplace. With around 60% securing places at Russell Group institutions, many progress into fields such as engineering, business, medicine and the arts. Extensive careers advice and tailored support for applications ensure that each student is well-prepared for their next steps, achieving their goals with confidence.

Art

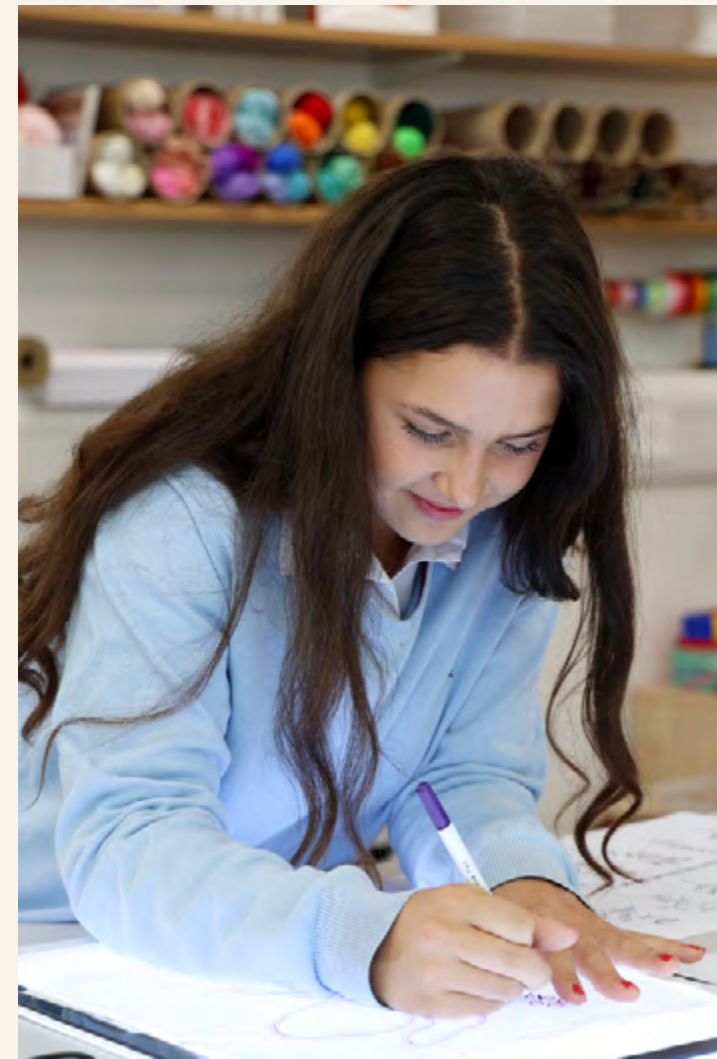
We nurture creativity and self-expression through art, guided by expert teachers who are practising artists.

Modern *Foreign Languages*

Our MFL department broadens students' cultural understanding and perspectives. In Key Stage 3, students have the opportunity to study French, Spanish and German, choosing two of these languages for Year 9.

From Year 10 all students are expected to learn a minimum of one language at GCSE. Our Sixth Form linguists benefit from one to one sessions with native language assistants, making this a personalised learning experience. Departmental highlights include a week celebrating European Day of Languages, featuring activities such as a cake-baking competition and international students leading language sessions. We also offer trips abroad - most recently to Estonia and Boulogne.



EAL (*English as an Additional Language*)

At Haberdashers' Monmouth School, we warmly welcome students from around the world.

Our experienced EAL teachers provide tailored support in small groups, helping pupils build confidence in reading, writing, listening and speaking English. We celebrate the cultural richness our international students bring, valuing bilingualism as a strength. EAL support includes IGCSE English as a Second Language, IELTS preparation and subject-specific help.

Business & Economics

Business

Economics

Humanities

Humanities explores the world through History, Geography and Religious Studies. Students examine past events, global challenges and ethical questions, developing critical thinking and a deeper understanding of society.

History

The History department takes students on a gripping journey through the modern world, exploring the dramatic events that shaped the 20th century. From the shattered hopes of Versailles to the fiery tensions of the Cold War, students will unravel the forces behind revolutions, economic crashes and the rise and fall of dictators. They'll dive into the glitz of the Jazz Age, the struggles of the Great Depression, and FDR's bold New Deal. With a focus on historical interpretation, debate and real-world relevance, we equip students with skills to decode today's global challenges - because history isn't just the past, it's the key to the future.

Classics

Monmouth's rich Classical heritage, rooted in its foundation by William Jones, continues to flourish today. Latin thrives in the department, where students from Year 7 to Year 11 follow Suburani, a dynamic, story-based course set in Nero's Rome. The department brings history alive with events including the Boudica Rebellion and the Great Fire of Rome. A level Latin students explore literature from comedy to tragedy and philosophy to history, studying authors such as Virgil, Ovid and Plato. With excellent Oxbridge success, unforgettable trips and vibrant clubs, Latin at Haberdashers' Monmouth School truly brings the ancient world to life.



Geography

Geography is exciting and relevant, allowing students to study the subject through a balanced framework of human and physical topics. Students travel the world from their classroom, exploring contemporary case studies in the UK, higher income countries, newly emerging countries and lower income countries. Geography is a varied discipline covering topics including urban issues, climate change, natural hazards, physical landscapes, global shifts in economic power and resource management.

Religious Studies

An exploration of faith, ethics and the role of religion in shaping the world. This course invites students of all backgrounds to dive into two major religions, examining their beliefs, values and influence on society. Engaging in thought-provoking ethical debates, students will challenge ideas, develop independent reasoning skills and form their own perspectives on complex global issues. No prior knowledge is needed, just curiosity and an open mind. This subject has strong links to subjects such as History, Philosophy and Politics.



Mathematics

Numerical, problem-solving and logical reasoning skills. Students learn to perform calculations efficiently, use a calculator effectively and assess the reasonableness of their answers.

They tackle multi-step problems using diverse methods and clearly express their reasoning both orally and in writing. Advanced topics of functions and differentiation provide a solid foundation for further study. At Haberdashers' Monmouth School, Maths equips students with essential skills for higher education and tangible applications, making it a key to success in many sectors.



Further Mathematics

This is designed for students with a passion for Maths and a strong track record at GCSE. It provides an advanced and rigorous challenge, ideal for those considering Mathematics, Physical Sciences or Engineering at top universities. Students complete the full A level Mathematics course in Year 12 before progressing to Further Mathematics in Year 13, studying it alongside two other A levels. While prior experience beyond GCSE is beneficial, it is not essential. Further Mathematics offers a rewarding and intellectually stimulating experience, equipping students with the skills needed for the most demanding mathematical fields.

Computer Science

Computer Science is a dynamic course that equips students with the skills to shape the digital world. From coding and problem-solving to artificial intelligence (AI) and cybersecurity, students develop both logical precision and creativity. They explore the ethical and societal impacts of technology while building a strong foundation in programming and computational thinking. We prepare our students for the ever-evolving tech landscape, opening doors to innovation. Whether designing apps, analysing data, or securing networks, Computer Science is the key to the future.

Performing *Arts*

With exceptional facilities including The Blake Theatre, Performing Arts Centre, two dance studios, Recital Hall, recording studios and the Glover Music School, students are equipped to thrive. Supported by our expert teachers and guided by our patron, Dame Jane Glover, Performing Arts nurtures passion, collaboration and innovation.



Dance

A popular department that combines creativity, performance and academic study. Students refine their technical skills, artistic expression and choreography while developing problem-solving and collaboration abilities. With opportunities to showcase their talent in a series of dance shows throughout the year, students gain confidence, discipline and stage experience. Dance nurtures innovation and can be enjoyed as an academic subject and as an enrichment option.

Music

Music is the heartbeat of our community, offering personalised learning and expert tuition. Students explore diverse styles - from classical to jazz, film and popular music - through ensembles, choirs and composition. They perform in concerts worldwide, including St. Paul's Cathedral, the Vatican and school traditions including Tea Concerts, the Blue Riband and Chapel Choir evensong. Whether performing, composing or appreciating music, every student finds their voice.

Drama

A thriving creative space where students develop confidence, performance skills and a love for theatre. Through acting, directing and analysis, students explore plays practically while refining their communication and leadership abilities. Students take part in the whole school production and annual musical, gaining real stage experience, while LAMDA qualifications further enhance their skills. Theatre visits, coursework and collaboration help nurture talent, creativity and self-expression.



Criminology & *Psychology*



From exploring crime and justice, to questioning reality and ethics, to studying the science of human behaviour, these courses offered at Sixth Form prepare students for successful careers in law, psychology and beyond.

Criminology

Criminology (Level 3 Applied Diploma) offers a thought-provoking exploration of crime, justice and society. The course examines the causes of criminal behaviour, the workings of the justice system and the wider impact of crime on communities. Through real-life case studies and critical discussions, students develop analytical skills essential for careers in law enforcement, forensic psychology and legal services.

Psychology

Discover the fascinating science of mind and behaviour with A level Psychology. Explore key topics such as memory, brain functioning, mental health and child development. Students gain valuable skills in critical thinking, research and analysis. Ideal for those curious about human behaviour and its application in sectors such as mental health, education and forensic psychology.



Sciences

At Haberdashers' Monmouth School, science thrives in a unique three-story science block, each floor dedicated to Biology, Chemistry or Physics. With world-class teachers, expert technicians and some of the best-equipped labs in the independent sector, our passionate departments inspires curiosity and innovation, offering an outstanding scientific education.

Biology

The Biology department is a dynamic, friendly environment, committed to developing in students a lively enthusiasm for Biology and the natural sciences. A variety of modern and traditional teaching approaches are employed and students are provided with extensive opportunities for practical work. They are encouraged to develop a depth of knowledge and a wide range of key skills. Students are informed of the latest developments in the biological sciences, including the ethical implications of recent innovations and the positive contributions that Biology makes to society.



Chemistry

Chemistry sparks curiosity, challenging young minds to explore the world scientifically. Students engage in a bespoke, hands-on experimental programme, fostering a love for discovery. Our STEM club takes learning beyond the syllabus, encouraging creativity and innovation. With five expert chemists, dynamic teaching and lively discussions, pupils are inspired to ask 'why' and 'how,' deepening their understanding of the complex world around them.

Monmouth Science Initiative

Students can ignite their passion for science beyond the classroom by joining the Monmouth Science Initiative (MSI), a dynamic part of our Wednesday Enrichment programme. MSI offers thrilling hands-on experiments and investigations across Biology, Chemistry and Physics, giving students the chance to explore actual scientific challenges. This offering not only deepens students' knowledge but also enhances UCAS applications, demonstrating advanced practical skills and independent research. In the summer term, students present their findings in university-style research papers.

Physics

Physics is an exciting journey into the forces shaping our universe. With expert teachers and cutting-edge equipment - from data loggers to telescopes - lessons are experimental and inspiring. Students develop key problem-solving skills, preparing them for careers in engineering, research and industry. Exploring everything from subatomic particles to cosmic structures, Physics is at the heart of modern technology and our future.

Sport & Outdoor

Sport and the great outdoors are an essential part of our ethos and a cornerstone of our vibrant community.



Whether striving for national honours or simply enjoying an active lifestyle, every student at Haberdashers' Monmouth School is encouraged to get involved, discover new interests and embrace the physical and mental benefits of movement.

Our major sports – **rugby, football, hockey, netball, cricket** and **rowing** – form the backbone of our year-round programme. Across all age groups, students develop their technical ability, tactical awareness and leadership skills, guided by a dedicated team of PE staff, academic teachers, external coaches and full-time strength and conditioning specialists.

Opportunities *for All*

Beyond our core sports, students can represent the school in **cross-country, golf, equestrian, swimming, tennis** and **athletics**. Each offers a pathway for aspiring athletes and many go on to achieve **county, regional** or **national** honours – a testament to the depth of our coaching and support.

At the heart of this inclusive approach is the **Eddie Butler Centre**. A cutting-edge facility supporting the physical development of every student. Whether training for elite sport or maintaining a healthy, active lifestyle, the Eddie Butler Centre reflects our belief that sport is for everyone.

Our programme encourages open discussion, tackling challenges head-on rather than avoiding them. By providing young people with tools and confidence, HABSMON inspires and equips them to thrive, ensuring every lesson is meaningful, empowering and designed with care to promote wellbeing and resilience. No topic is off-limits, helping students feel heard and supported.



House Structure

Pastoral care is offered through both a horizontal and vertical structure. We feel it is essential that every student has multiple layers of support as they continue their journey through the school. Not only does our pastoral structure provide age-appropriate care, it also instils a sense of community, pride and belonging.



Families

Every student is attached to one of four Families, comprising Bagnall Oakeley, Imbert Terry, Mather Jackson and Prosser. They remain in that Family throughout their Haberdashers' Monmouth School journey. For sporting and other internal competitions, students represent their Family.

Pastoral Houses

Students are looked after within pastoral day or boarding houses, which change as they progress through the school. For example, a Year 9 student in Bagnall Oakeley will join Hereford House for their Year 9 to Year 11 experience, where they will have a Pastoral Lead to look after them. Boarding houses, for boys and girls, remain as they are with Housemasters and Housemistresses looking after the pastoral care of their students.



Aspire *Programme*

The Haberdashers' Aspire programme is a structured mentoring initiative that connects Sixth Form students with professional mentors from the Haberdashers' network and beyond.

Designed to support both academic and personal growth, it provides students with valuable guidance in making informed decisions about their future. The programme pairs students with alumni mentors in their chosen sectors, offering personalised sessions that enhance networking opportunities, career advice and internship access. 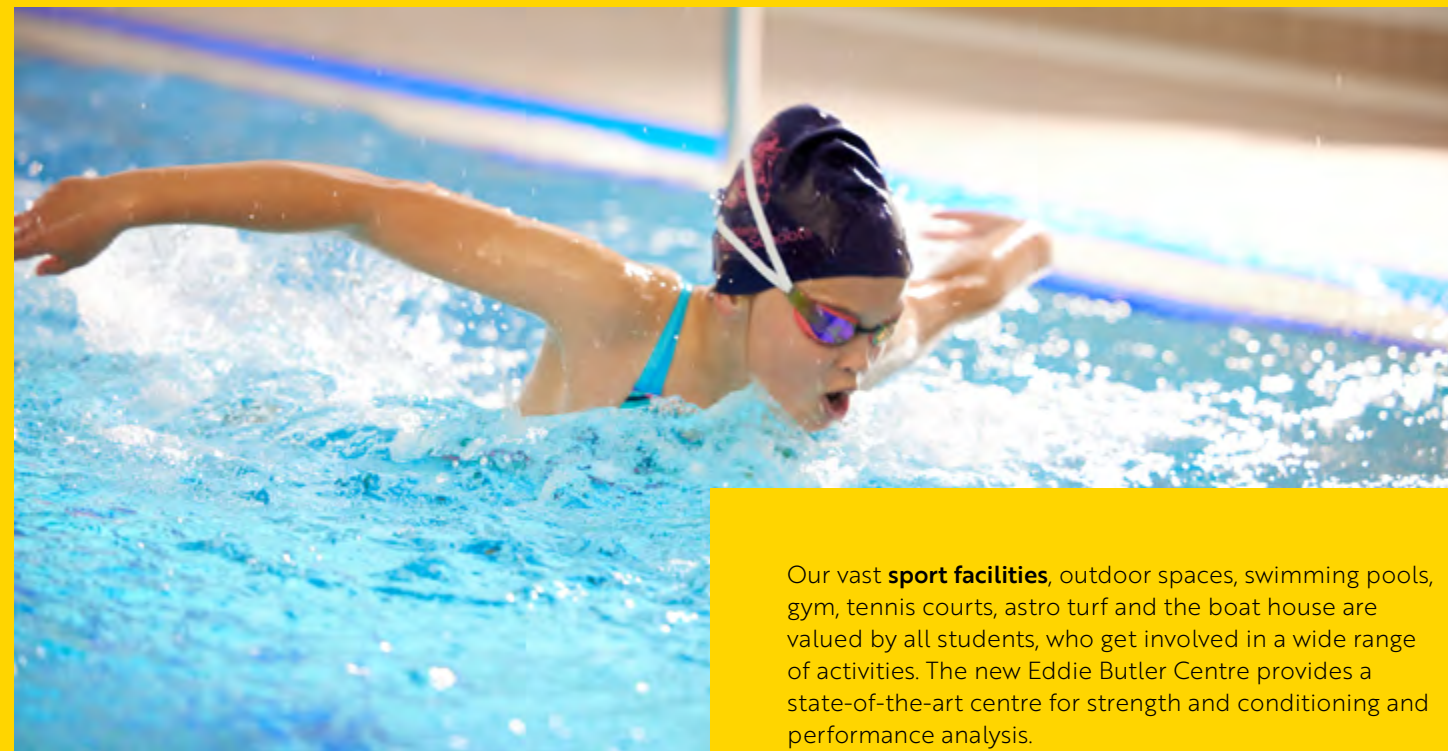
Careers

We offer comprehensive and personalised careers support to help our students discover and pursue their aspirations. Our dedicated careers periods and the Aspire programme provide tailored mentorship, drawing on the expertise of the Haberdashers' family to guide students along their chosen career path. We offer a wide range of talks and presentations, including topics such as 'Maximising Your Sixth Form Experience,' 'Applying to International Universities' and 'Gap Year Opportunities.'

Year 12 is focused on researching courses, universities, apprenticeships and crafting personal statements. Year 13 is centred on UCAS, Oxbridge and apprenticeship applications, with tailored support for admissions tests, aptitude assessments and interviews.

Medical, veterinary and dental students benefit from specialist guidance provided by their tutor who has over 20 years of experience supporting these students through the university application process.

Students also gain valuable exposure to various careers through opportunities including our own careers convention, a law-focused trip to the Old Bailey, a real estate conference and a law conference hosted at Haberdashers' Hall. These events provide students with direct insights into different industries and broaden their career horizons.



Campus Facilities

The school has been a landmark of Monmouth town for five centuries and occupies some of the most eye-catching and historic buildings in the picturesque and safe town.

The recent injection of investment into the campus ensures that we continue to provide students with some of the best facilities in the region for their studies, sports and socialising.

Our new **Sixth Form Centre** offers students more freedom and independence in a setting more akin to a university campus. There is a stunning atrium and vast social areas including a Costa Coffee outlet where students enjoy spending free time. Boarders enjoy a perfect mix of study and fun, joining day students during school hours before heading back to their houses from 4pm. Evenings have a balance of structured study time and relaxed downtime - whether that's unwinding with friends, enjoying house events, or making a snack in the kitchen.

Weekends are packed with opportunities, from sports and arts to music and drama, keeping everyone busy and entertained. Senior boarders are in single-sex houses with rooms of two to five students, while Sixth Formers enjoy individual en-suite rooms, giving them a taste of university-style living.

International

Around half of our boarders are international students from over 20 different countries. Our international students enjoy our supportive environment that focuses on academic success.

Students settle quickly into their boarding houses and studies and are supported by the teachers and Housemasters and Housemistresses. Some students board from an early age, while others start in the Senior School.

Students can join us in most year groups and at various stages in the academic year. Alongside GCSE and A level pathways, we offer a one-year Sixth Form Foundation Year (SFFY), allowing international students to complete six GCSEs in one year while improving their English. Most progress to A levels at the school. We also provide a one-term English immersion programme. Full details on both programmes are available on our website.

Outside of the SFFY course, international students are fully integrated into the school life. They are taught as a dedicated group but join their housemates for boarding, sport, co-curricular activities and all other aspects of school life.

Located just 2.5 hours from London, the school offers a pick-up and drop-off service to and from Heathrow Airport, ensuring a reliable and safe journey. Students enjoy the wonderful town of Monmouth and all that it has to offer.
